The Reading Jr. Royals executive board reserves the right to review special situations and grant a refund where they unanimously agree it is warranted. The Reading Jr. Royals also reserve the right to revoke membership privileges for a member's failure to adhere to the USA Hockey Code of Conduct, DVHL Code of Conduct or Reading Jr. Royals Parental Pledge and Code of Ethics.

It is understood that if payments are delinquent, all membership privileges are revoked until my account is in compliance with the agreed upon payment plan. This includes, but is not limited to, practices, home/away games, tournaments where the team is registered as a Reading Jr. Royals team or dressed in the Reading Jr. Royals' uniform, and any on-ice and off-ice events affiliated with the Reading Jr. Royals organization. In addition a 10% late fee will be assessed on the delinquent balance for remittances received 5 days after agreed upon due date. For example, if your 2<sup>nd</sup> payment totals \$232.50, it is due on May 31<sup>st</sup>, if it is received on June 5<sup>th</sup>, it considered delinquent and the late fee is \$23.25. A \$25 service fee will be charged to members for bank returned checks.

### CODE OF ETHICS/CODE OF CONDUCT

All players are bound by, and are subject to, the applicable rules, regulations, policies and procedures, penalties, sanctions and Codes of Conduct, of USA Hockey and the Delaware Valley Hockey League, as more fully set forth in the USA Hockey Annual Guide posted on USA Hockey's website ([http://www.usahockey.com/membership/main\\_site/main/annual\\_guide](http://www.usahockey.com/membership/main_site/main/annual_guide)), and on the Delaware Valley Hockey League's website under "General Information" (<http://www.dvhl.org/Generalinfo.htm>).

In addition to the above, the Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey Association expects all players to conduct themselves in an orderly, sportsmanlike and professional manner when playing or practicing as a member of a Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey team. Playing for the Reading Jr. Royals is a privilege to be earned, not an entitlement. Therefore, when playing for a Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey team, I recognize, acknowledge and agree to abide by the following fundamental ethical principles:

1. The name on the front of my jersey is equally as important as the name on the back. I will conduct myself at all times so as to maintain the highest principles, integrity, and dignity for both myself and the Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey Association.
2. I will adhere to the spirit as well as the letter of the playing rules established by the Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey Association, the Delaware Valley Hockey League and USA Hockey.
3. I will accept the authority of all game officials and at no time will I demonstrably question the decisions and actions of game officials, particularly on-ice officials and referees.
4. I acknowledge that my strong desire to compete and succeed is in no way compromised by respect for the rule book and respect for all opponents. Acceptance of this concept is the very heart of sportsmanship and fair play. I will behave in a sportsmanlike manner.
5. I understand that it is the policy of the Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey Association that its players not use illegal drugs or other illegal performance enhancing substances. I agree to abide by this policy.

Any report of disorderly conduct in the rink, the locker room, the parking lot or otherwise, including but not limited to the following, will not be tolerated by the Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey Association:

1. Physical or verbal confrontation with teammates, members of any other Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey team, referees, coaches, players from opposing teams, parents from opposing teams and/or rink employees.

2. Possessing or threatening use of a weapon.
3. Possessing or using any illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco products, or being under the influence of illegal drugs or alcohol, while inside the rink facility, whether prior to, during or after a practice or game.
4. Intentionally or knowingly violating the Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey Association policy against its players using illegal drugs or other illegal performance enhancing substances.
5. Displaying violent or threatening behavior, including being involved in a physical altercation regardless of provocation, or threatening physical bodily harm to a coach, parent, legal guardian, spectator, teammate or other player.
6. Exhibiting loud or obnoxious behavior that exceeds generally accepted standards of sportsmanship.
7. Throwing ice, tape, equipment, food or other items, whether prior to, during or after a game or practice, including inside the locker room.
8. Destruction or defacing of locker room and/or property belonging to others, including teammates.
9. Stealing.
10. Going into the referee's locker room or an opposing team's locker room.

Players are expected to be dressed and ready to play at least fifteen minutes prior to taking the ice for practices and games. Players are also expected to clean up after themselves, leaving the locker room the way it was found.

### Disciplinary Procedures

The Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey Association has ZERO TOLERANCE for violations of the above Code of Ethics/Code of Conduct. The failure to observe this Code of Ethics/Code of Conduct will result in an investigation by the Disciplinary Committee of the Executive Board of the Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey Association. If the investigation concludes that the Code of Ethics/Code of Conduct has been violated, the Disciplinary Committee will recommend the following minimum disciplinary sanctions be taken by the Executive Board:

The offending player shall be given the right to appear in person, together with his or her parent or legal guardian and/or coach, before the Disciplinary Committee and/or the Executive Board to explain why the above penalties or additional penalties should not be assessed and/or to request reinstatement following the end of the suspension. The Executive Board retains the ultimate discretion to impose any sanctions for violation of the Code of Ethics/Code of Conduct, and may impose lesser or additional sanctions over and above those recommended by the Disciplinary Committee and/or to impose additional or alternative behavioral requirements prior to reinstating participation privileges. Any suspension, for part or all of the

remainder of any season DOES NOT constitute grounds for a refund of any registration fees or for the cancellation of any remaining payments due under the payment schedule, if any.

### CODE OF ETHICS/CODE OF CONDUCT

All parents are bound by, and are subject to, the applicable rules, regulations, policies and procedures, penalties, sanctions and Codes of Conduct, of USA Hockey and the Delaware Valley Hockey League, as more fully set forth in the USA Hockey Annual Guide posted on USA Hockey's website ([http://www.usahockey.com/membership/main\\_site/main/annual\\_guide](http://www.usahockey.com/membership/main_site/main/annual_guide)), and on the Delaware Valley Hockey League's website under "General Information" (<http://www.dvhl.org/Generalinfo.htm>).

In addition to the above, the Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey Association expects all parents and legal guardians to conduct themselves in an orderly, sportsmanlike and professional manner when attending a game or practice of a Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey team. Each parent and legal guardian shall recognize, acknowledge and agree to abide by the following fundamental ethical principles:

1. Parents and legal guardians are role models. As such, I shall conduct myself so as to maintain the highest principles of integrity and dignity.
2. Parents and legal guardians should never place the value of a win above the objective of developing the skills of their children and instilling the highest ideals and character traits in their children. The safety, welfare and best interests of the children shall always be uppermost in my mind and I will not sacrifice these values for personal prestige or personal gain.
3. Parents and legal guardians should never teach their children tactics or skills designed to circumvent the intent of the rulebook and the standards of fair play. The rules exist to protect the players and to provide a common standard by which final results will be determined.
4. Children are involved in organized sports for their enjoyment. I will conduct myself in a manner that emphasizes their skill, development, discipline and sportsmanship.
5. I understand that my general responsibility to my child and to the sport of hockey itself includes all children and players, whether on my child's team or on an opponent's team.
6. I will show respect and positive support for all coaches and officials, prior to, during and after a game or practice. I will provide support and I will not openly instruct during the game or openly interpret the rules.
7. I will abide by the rulings of the officials, coaches and league administrators prior to, during and after a game or practice.

8. I understand that it is the policy of the Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey Association that its players not use illegal drugs or other illegal performance enhancing substances. I agree to support this policy.
9. If any concerns or grievances with respect to any matter concerning my child arise, I will follow, and not circumvent, the grievance policy set forth in Article 11 of the Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey Association Bylaws.

Disorderly conduct in the rink, the locker room, the parking lot or otherwise, including but not limited to the following, will not be tolerated by the Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey Association:

1. Physical or verbal confrontation with members of any Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey team, referee, coach, player from opposing teams, parents from opposing teams and/or rink employees.
2. Possessing or threatening use of a weapon.
3. While inside any rink facility in connection with a Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey practice, game or other sanctioned event (a) possessing or using any illegal drugs or alcohol, or (b) being under the influence of illegal drugs or a sufficient amount of alcohol such that an individual is engaged in conduct deemed to constitute "offensive behavior" as determined by the Executive Board or the Disciplinary Committee of the Executive Board, in their sole discretion, or that such individual would be rendered incapable of safely driving, operating or being in actual physical control of the movement of a motor vehicle, as determined under the Pennsylvania DUI Law.
4. Intentionally assisting in the violation of the Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey Association policy against its players using illegal drugs or other illegal performance enhancing substances.
5. Displaying violent or threatening behavior, including being involved in a physical altercation regardless of provocation or threatening physical bodily harm to a coach, parent, legal guardian, spectator, child or player.
6. Exhibiting loud or obnoxious behavior that exceeds generally accepted standards of sportsmanship.
7. Going on the ice, unless invited by the head coach or any assistant coach.
8. Throwing anything onto the ice, whether prior to, during or after a game or practice.
9. Going into a locker room of a Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey Association team less than 20 minutes before or 20 minutes after a game or practice unless specifically invited by the head coach.
10. Going into the referee's locker room or an opposing team's locker room.
11. Sending threatening or harassing communications (whether written or oral) to coaches, team representatives, board members, referees, parents, legal guardians, or anyone else affiliated with the Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey program regarding, among other things, a particular team or player, playing time or any other matter which the board shall later determine. For purposes of this Code of Ethics/Code of Conduct, a communication will be considered to be threatening or harassing if there are three or more communications within a 48 hour period relating to one or a substantially similar topic the intent of which, in the sole discretion of the Executive Board or the Disciplinary Committee of the Executive Board, is to threaten or harass the recipient.

In addition, all parents and legal guardians shall be responsible for the behavior of all of their children at all times.

Disciplinary Procedures

The Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey Association has ZERO TOLERANCE for violations of the above Code of Ethics/Code of Conduct. The failure to observe this Code of Ethics/Code of Conduct will result in an investigation by the Disciplinary Committee of the Executive Board of the Reading Jr. Royals Youth Ice Hockey Association. - Third Violation: Suspended for at least the remainder of the season; potential expulsion from all Reading Jr. Royals Youth Hockey Association events, with reinstatement for future seasons permitted upon petition and approval of the Executive Board in its sole discretion.

The offending parent or legal guardian shall be given the right to appear in person before the Disciplinary Committee and/or the Executive Board to explain why the above penalties or additional penalties should not be assessed and/or to request reinstatement following the end of the suspension. The Executive Board retains the ultimate discretion to impose any sanctions for violation of the Code of Ethics/Code of Conduct, and may impose lesser or additional sanctions over and above those recommended by the Disciplinary Committee and/or to impose additional or alternative behavioral requirements prior to reinstating participation privileges. Any suspension, for part or all of the remainder of any season DOES NOT constitute grounds for a refund of any registration fees or for the cancellation of any remaining payments due under the payment schedule, if any.

## DELAWARE VALLEY HOCKEY LEAGUE (DVHL) PLAYER/PARENT AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is entered into in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania between

("The Player") and jointly and severally by the Player's parent and/or legal guardian,

("The Parent") and \_\_\_\_\_ ("The Club"), a youth hockey

organization for the 2008 / 2009 hockey season, which is defined as lasting from the date of signing of this agreement until the completion of the USA Hockey National Tournaments ("The Season"). It is understood that the Parties **intend to be legally bound by this Agreement**, and that this Agreement was signed in, and is enforceable, in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and that all references to the Player includes males and females.

1. **The Parent understands that if the Player resigns or otherwise voluntarily terminates his/her participation for any reason after signing this agreement, the Player is not entitled to a refund of the Player Fee and must pay the entire remaining balance of the Player Fee before a DVHL/Atlantic District Player Release Form will be issued.**
2. The player agrees to play DVHL amateur ice hockey exclusively for the above mentioned Club and may not register for, be evaluated for or play for any other DVHL club. The player may also participate with any school, independent or Atlantic District run program. Dual rostering is not permitted on any Tier I (AAA), Tier II (AA, A, B, C) or any Junior Programs; however, Girls are permitted to be dual rostered on any Tier I (AAA), Tier II (AA, A, B, C) or Girls team. If both teams are National Tournament bound, the player must declare, in writing, by 12/31/2008, for which team she will participate should these teams qualify for Districts, leading to the National Tournament.
3. The Player agrees that he/she will attend all of the Club's ice practices, games, off-ice training, instructional sessions and organized team meetings, except when prevented from doing so for educational or medical reasons, in which case, the player will request permission in advance (when reasonably possible to do so) to be absent. The club acknowledges that such permission will be granted for all reasonable requests. The player agrees that he/she will maintain his/her academic and educational course work at the/she highest-level possible.
4. The Club will provide the Player USA Hockey and Atlantic District registration unless the player has been previously registered by another organization.
5. The Player agrees to obey the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and that he/she will maintain good citizenship and behavior at all Club events, as well as in his/her everyday life, recognizing that his/her behavior is a reflection upon the Club.
6. The Player agrees not to use vulgar or profane language, racial, ethnic or gender related slurs toward teammates, coaches, officials, opponents or spectators.
7. The Player agrees that alcohol, tobacco products, and all legally banned substances, which includes marijuana, cocaine, non-prescribed medications, including performance enhancing substances and other related drugs, have no place in hockey and Player agrees not participate in such use.
8. The Player recognizes that there is no place for violent or overly aggressive play in hockey where the obvious intent is to injure or harm another player, and agrees not to participate in such conduct.
9. The Parent agrees to respect and show appreciation for the volunteers who give their time to hockey. Parent further agrees not to yell, taunt, threaten or inflict physical violence upon any player, coach, official or spectator at any Club function.
10. The Parent agrees to be responsible for the financial commitment made in this Agreement (which includes the payment of a Registration Fee and a Player Fee), even in the event that Player's Club or playing privileges are suspended and/or terminated for any reason, including but not limited to disciplinary or academic issues, injury or illness, and understand this to mean that in no case will the Player Fee be prorated for any portion of the season.
11. The Parent agrees that the Registration fee is non-refundable. Once the Player is placed on a team that fee is credited to the Player Fee. If the Player declines his/her position on a team, after the date designated by the Club, the Player will **not** be entitled to receive a refund. Should the Club determine that the Player's ice hockey talent development is best suited for placement on an in-house team (if applicable) the Registration fee less \_\_\_\_\_ will be either refunded, or applied to the in-house team Player Fee.
12. The parent shall be obligated to pay the Club tuition as established in Addendum The Club's Payment Schedule for participation as a member of the Club, with the understanding that if a payment is delinquent, then the Player's
